This event is about a Re-kindling of the Vision of Elijah Harper's Sacred Assembly 30 Years Ago in 1995. Elijah recognized that both the political process and the religious process of the church of the residential schools has failed us. A spiritual element that recognized human stewardship under God as both the Creator and the Owner of all things with ultimate authority was missing.

Former Prime Minister Jean Chretien agreed with Elijah Harper, but said that since a spiritual process is needed, the church in Canada would need to lead this process. We, the church, now need to pick up this mantle if we are to find a prophetic voice with government leaders that recognizes the separation of church and state, but not of God and state, and that while Christ's Kingdom does not come from this world, it is most decidedly for this world!

1 Alan B. Harper was the chief mentor to his son Elijah, and was the faithful pastor of the Red Sucker Lake Full Gospel Church in northern Manitoba for 54 years. In the early 1980s, he became the initial First Nations minister to be licensed by the Fellowship of Christian Assemblies in Manitoba through Glen Forsberg. 2 Alan B. Today, there are over thirty First Nations Churches and Ministers who are licensed by the Fellowship of Christian Assemblies in Manitoba. The main visionary of this strategic Conference in Winnipeg from June 5 to 7, 2025 is Robert McLean who has previously planted some 30 churches in northern Manitoba. He and his wife Beverley, were catalysts in a Prayer Meeting in his community that went non-stop 24/7 for three years in the late 1970s. Joining him in this vision are his son Marty and also Roger Armbruster, both friends of Elijah Harper and both ministers with the FCA.
